Proof of Social Security Numbers for all household members (documentation required).

Most recent heat bill.

4. Most recent electric bill.

WAGE EARNERS

Please bring copies fo your check stubs for the 30-day period preceding the date of application, or a copy of your most recent federal income tax return.

FIXED INCOME

This income may inclue: Social Security Benefits, Supplemental Security Income, Veteran's Assistance, Unemployment Insuramnce, and pensions. Please bring copies to your check stubs from the previous 30 days.

SELF-EMPLOYED/FARMERS

Please bring a copy of your most recent federal income tax return.

Note - Additional countable income and/or income verification not listed above may be required for eligibility determination.

If you receive alimony or child support, it will also need to be verified. Additional income not listed here may be required.
