

# 2025 GARBAGE INFORMATION

## GARBAGE PICKUP

Monday and Friday – Residential

Monday, Wednesday, and Friday – Commercial

City provides one (1) sixty-five (65) gallon container per pickup. A resident shall be charged \$3.00 for each additional bag. In the event a resident moves from their residence and/or causes damage to the city owned garbage can, then the resident will be charged \$60.00 to their City of Bellevue utility invoice.

Please have materials contained and well drained (water added to solid waste increases cost). Bring to designated area, usually curb or alleyway and do not block area to cans and dumpsters.

Extra pickups for large items including, but not limited to, carpet, couches, chairs, mattresses, any other furniture, etc., are available by appointment by contacting City Hall at 872-4456. Pickups happen on Wednesdays and an extra fee of \$60.00\* will be charged for these items. \*Price subject to change depending on items set out. Charges will be applied to your City of Bellevue utility invoice.

2-yard dumpsters are available to rent short-term or long-term at \$60.00 per month. \$30.00 will be charged each time a full dumpster is dumped (\$15.00 for half full and \$7.50 for a quarter full). Construction materials will be dumped at a rate of \$45.00 for a full dumpster (\$22.50 for half full and \$11.25 for a quarter full). Contact City Hall at 872-4456 to arrange a drop off. Charges will be applied to your City of Bellevue utility invoice.

## E-WASTE

TV's, microwaves, computer monitors & towers, tablets & cell phones, and scrap metal must be separated from garbage. Please arrange for a separate pickup; an extra fee of \$20.00 for the pickup (\$10.00 if dropped off at public works building) and an additional \$.30 per pound, will be charged to your City of Bellevue utility invoice.

## PAPER PRODUCTS

### ACCEPTABLE

All types of clean office and junk paper, school papers  
Newspapers  
Paper bags and cardboard egg cartons  
Magazines and catalogs, shiny paged, glued, stapled  
Corrugated cardboard  
Chipboard containers – cereal boxes, Kleenex, cake mix  
Toilet paper & paper towel rolls  
Shredded paper strips  
Phone books, paper and hard cover books  
Clean paper, plastic wrap & Styrofoam out of ALL boxes

## PAPER PRODUCTS

### UNACCEPTABLE

Disposable diapers  
Milk and juice cartons  
Photographs, greeting cards  
Food-encrusted pizza boxes  
Cereal box liners, pet food bags  
Slick coated frozen food boxes  
Paper plates, cups, and napkins  
Gift wrap paper  
Cross cut paper

Items must be clean and dry. Flatten cardboard boxes.

## METAL

### ACCEPTABLE

Aluminum  
Extension Cords, Christmas Light Strands  
Tin, steel, and aluminum cans  
Metal jar lids  
EMPTY paint and aerosol containers (use cat litter, sand, sawdust, etc. to dry up paint).

### UNACCEPTABLE

Pesticide, chemical containers  
Syringes  
Car parts and oil filters  
Batteries

## **\*MOST ABUSED TENDECIES**

\*Containers, either glass, tin or plastic are not rinsed.

\*Caps on plastic containers.

\*Wet cardboard (refrain from setting out on inclement day or bring to Public Works Building during working hours).

\*If possible, flatten tin cans with lids inside.

## PLASTIC PRODUCTS

### ACCEPTABLE

Milk and juice jugs  
Margarine and ice cream tubs  
Yogurt cups  
Pop and water bottles  
Household cleaning containers  
Shampoo & lotion bottles  
Dish and liquid soap bottles  
Bleach and detergent containers  
Cooking oil containers

## PLASTIC PRODUCTS

### UNACCEPTABLE

Plastic bags  
Motor oil, anti-freeze containers  
Unsanitary containers  
Plastic with a #6 symbol  
Items with no recycling symbol  
Prescription pill bottles  
Plastic film wrap  
Syringes  
Styrofoam, including Styrofoam egg cartons

ONLY items with a #1, 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7 recycling symbols are acceptable. Rinse and flatten all items. Labels may be left on. Discard caps, rings, and pumps with your other household refuse.

## GLASS

### UNACCEPTABLE

Should be included with regular garbage OR can be taken to the dop off site at the public works building located on Vine Street.
